Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the 92nd National Convention was held virtually July 28-July 31 via Zoom Meetings for the safety of all participants, and offered at a discounted price in a successful attempt to drive registrations up to the maximum of 500. This year, the sorority used a new convention and meetings platform called *Whova* that enabled sorors to keep track of and enter convention sessions, meet and greet each other, set up get-togethers, learn more about other chapters from the Central Region and other regions, shop the

convention vendors, and explore Iota History in a virtual museum.

Alpha Zeta Chapter was excited to have so many things going on for this year's convention:

- * Two Alpha Zeta sorors on the national Technology Support Team.
- * Three lines of new Sorors, many of whom were attending as First-Timers.
- * *Eleven* Sorors registered as First-Timers for the National Convention.
- The Central Regional Outstanding Business Woman of the Year, new Soror Deletra Hudson.
- The Central Regional Soror of the Year, Soror Cheryl Watts.



Wednesday, July 28th featured, for sorors:

- the opening of the virtual vendors' marketplace, open 24/7 to all attendees of the convention
- a virtual photo booth
- the opening of the virtual Iota History Museum
- a Youth Summit
- the Delegates' Forum, which presented information about motions and parliamentary procedure to Voting Delegates (Soror Cheryl Watts was a presenter);
- a meeting of the Past National Officers with convention First-Timers (11 from Alpha Zeta!)
- pre-convention workshops (Conducting Iota Business Post-COVID-19, Own Your Campus The Business of the Undergraduate Experience
- the Youth Entrepreneur Elevator Pitch Tournament

The host chapter, Rho, of Raleigh-Durham, North Carolina, started the convention off on Thursday, July 29th with a wonderful greeting and invitation to all sorors to come visit when they can, and a powerful address from Kristi Jones, Chief of Staff for the Office of the Governor of North Carolina – the first Black Woman to hold that position. That speech was followed, of course, by the normal business of the convention, the Leadership Institute, the Educational Forum, and awards carried out over the next two days. Sorors, if you thought Alpha Zeta rocked at the Regional Conference, you should be even prouder of the awards the Chapter received at the National Convention! Although Soror Deletra Hudson did not win the national Outstanding Business Woman of the Year and Soror Cheryl Watts did not win the national Soror of the Year titles, their credentials were highly-regarded in the competition. One of 9 Central Region awardees, Soror Paula Sams received a Legacy Award for the induction of her daughter, Ada, as a new Soror into Alpha Zeta Chapter. Certificates of Merit were received by Sorors Cheryl Watts (Iota. Talks, 92nd Pre-Convention presenter) and Miranda Avant-Elliott (92nd Convention presenter). Alpha Zeta was awarded for convention attendance AND chapter growth in the Central Region. Ophelia Troupe was named Regional Outstanding Chapter President for 2020-2021. Alpha Zeta was cited as the 2020-2021 Outstanding Chapter of the Central Region.
